Striped Pot

What you will need

Assorted Fimo colours

Sharp craft knife

Tin can



1. Remove the label from an empty baked bean tin and wash in warm soapy water.
2. Knead Fimo in the colour of your choice between your hands until it is soft and easy to work with.
3. Roll out each colour into sheets of approximately 2mm thick using a rolling pin or glass bottle. Using a sharp knife cut out strips of colour, ensuring they are long enough to go around the circumference of your tin.

Tip: Why not mix bespoke shades of Fimo to match your home decor or graduate subtle shades of blue, green or yellow by simply adding more and more white to your base colour.



4. Wrap the strips around the tin, gently pressing onto the surface of the tin. Use your finger to smooth the joins at the back of the tin.
5. Place your completed tin in a domestic oven and bake for 20 -30 minutes at 265 degrees F, 129 degrees C. Remove when cool.

Mosaic Pot

What you will need

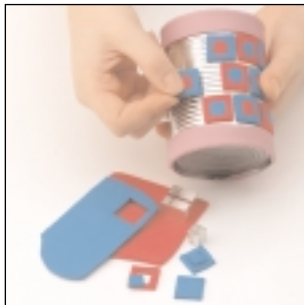
Assorted Fimo colours
Eberhard Faber Ceramofix Powder
Tin can
Cutter



1. Remove the label from an empty baked bean tin and wash in warm soapy water.

2. Knead Fimo in the colour of your choice between your hands until it is soft and easy to work with.

3. Roll out a sheet of Fimo and cut into two strips approximately 1 inch wide, ensuring they are long enough to go around the circumference of your tin.



4. Wrap one strip round the top and one around the bottom gently pressing onto the surface of the tin.

5. Cut squares of Fimo using a cutter or free hand, gently press onto the surface of the tin. Leave a gap of approximately 2mm between each square.



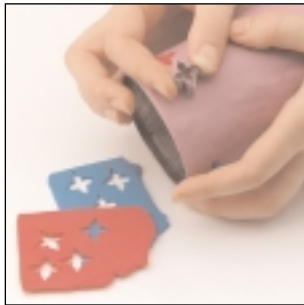
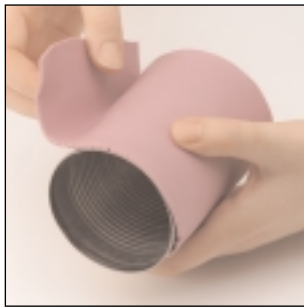
6. Place your completed tin in a domestic oven and bake for 20 -30 minutes at 265 degrees F, 129 degrees C. Remove when cool.

7. Once cooled, mix Ceramofix with water to a creamy consistency and using your fingers grout between the squares. Remove any excess Ceramofix with a damp cloth. Leave to dry.

Cut Outs

What you will need

Assorted Fimo colours
Tin can
Cutter
Craft knife
Sharp Pencil



- 1.** Remove the label from an empty baked bean tin and wash in warm soapy water.
- 2.** Knead Fimo in the colour of your choice between your hands until it is soft and easy to work with.
- 3.** Roll your base Fimo colour in to a sheet approximately 2mm thick using a rolling pin or glass bottle. Make sure it is big enough to cover the tin. Gently press onto the surface of the tin and trim excess Fimo at the top and bottom.
- 4.** Using a cutter, create a pattern around your tin, carefully removing Fimo as you go. Roll out a contrasting Fimo colour to the same thickness (2 mm) Use cutter to make designs, gently remove and place in the spaces on your tin.
- 5.** Add 'highlights' to the design. Using a sharp pencil, make holes in the Fimo and roll small balls of a contrasting Fimo colour, gently press into the holes. Roll a sheet of Fimo and cut into a strip, gently press around the bottom of the tin.
- 6.** Place your completed tin in a domestic oven and bake for 20 -30 minutes at 265 degrees F, 129 degrees C. Remove when cool.

Cutlery Handles

The mosaic and cutout designs can be applied to metal cutlery handles. Simply follow the instructions and place your completed knife in a domestic oven and bake for 20 -30 minutes at 265F, 129 C.
